Phonics

Focussing on the skills of blending and segmenting CCVC, CVCC, CCVCC, CVC+ previously taught digraphs. Well-known traditional repetitive stories and songs provide a focus for activities to blending and segmenting skills, whilst increasing automaticity to read and write captions and sentences.

#### Communication and Language

- Sharing fiction and non-fiction books about different countries and cultures around the world
- Talking about our experiences of different cultures and countries

#### Literacy

- Reading stories from around the world
- Using phonics skills to decode new words when reading information
- Writing labels to describe habitats
- Practising using capital letters, full stops and spaces between words when writing

#### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Talking about what makes communities different and showing respect for this
- Similarities and differences between people

This project teaches children about the global community to which they belong and explores how living things, communities and climates differ around the world.

#### Mathematics

- Matching numbers to quantities (up to 20)
- Estimating
- Ordering numbers (up to 20) and working out missing numbers in a sequence
- Exploring shape
- Counting on and back- addition and subtraction
- Subitising (recognising how many without counting)

#### Understanding the World (Driver Subject)

- Studying journeys
- Modes of transport
- Maps and plans of different places/areas including looking at maps of the world and the UK
- Learning about different cultural backgrounds/countries around the world and comparing to our environment
- Learning facts about animals from around the world
- The climates of different countries
- Comparing our lives with those of other children around the world
- Buildings around the world and their uses
- Caring for our world

#### Physical Development

- Developing fine motor skills
- Forming capital letters, securing formation of lowercase letters
- PE - two sessions per week
- Playground games from around the world
- Exploring African Dance

#### Expressive Arts and Design

- 3D models of transport and vehicles using recycled materials
- Creating masks of animals from around the world
- Studying and replicating Australian aboriginal art looking closely at pattern
- Weaving
- Role-play area – Travel Agents
